ST. PIUS V CHURCH ANNIVERSARY “FACELIFT”



Under the careful supervision of the pastor, Fr. Thomas Scott, St. Pius V Church in MUKWONAGO (MILWAUKEE), WI

recently underwent an artistic interior renovation in preparation for its 25th anniversary as a traditional chapel.

The church itself was built in the 1920's as St. James Church of the archdiocese of Milwaukee. In 1978, a week after it was closed, the church was put up for sale and some traditionally-minded parishioners decided to purchase it from the archdiocese to preserve their parish and so that Fr. Hugh Wish, a retired diocesan priest, could say the Mass of All Time there. Of course when the liberal Archbishop Weakland discovered this (after the sale had been completed), he was not very happy about the matter, nevertheless, amazingly he declined to

persecute Fr. Wish.

Coincidentally, the first Mass that Fr. Wish celebrated in the newly renamed St. Pius V Church was on September 3, 1978, the Feast of St. Pius X. After Fr. Wish's death in 1979 a variety of priests serviced the independent chapel, until 1999, when the SSPX was asked to serve it. Fr. Thomas Scott was assigned as the first SSPX pastor, and has been there almost continuously, with the exception of a 10-month hiatus.

Fr. Scott wanted to appropriately embellish the sanctuary and nave, and so meeting with Br. Marcel (stationed in Winona) and the Conrad Schmidt Studios, a comprehensive design was formulated.

Before any work could be started however, the funds had to be available. Fortunately the parish had a substantial savings account from over the years, but this needed to be supplemented. So a raffle was held, the highlight of which consisted of the auctioning off of a 100th

The scene depicts Christ triumphant in Heaven as Lord and Judge, and surrounding Him are His Mother, St. John the Baptist, Sts. Peter and Paul, the four Evangelists, and figures of the Old Testament.



While in the nave, centered above each stained glass window are these bas-reliefs depicting the episcopal coat of arms of Archbishop Lefebvre, Bishop de Castro Mayer, the 4 bishops of the SSPX, Sts. Peter and Paul, and Popes St. Pius V and St. Pius X.

anniversary edition Harley Davidson motorcycle, valued at \$12,000 (the cost of which was donated by a parishioner). In the end, the raffle raised over \$33,000.

Work began on October 28, 2003 and proceeded steadily until its completion on December 21, 2003. The total cost of the renovation was slightly over \$100,000.

To top matters off, the parish was able to purchase the adjacent properties which included a former Protestant church, school and rectory, which will be used as a parish hall, classrooms and rectory respectively.

ILLINOIS

On the Feast of the Presentation of Our Lady, November 21st, Our Lady Immaculate Church in OAK PARK (CHICAGO), IL witnessed the impressive ceremonies of engagements made by young boys and girls of the Eucharistic Crusade.

With origins dating back to 1844, and having the encouragement of such ecclesiastical giants as Pope St. Pius X and Archbishop Lefebvre (who was even a member as a young boy), the Eucharistic Crusade has a hallowed history.

The chief aim of the Eucharistic Crusade is to teach children to habitually practice Catholic virtues, and thereby lead a holy life. This is done by having children offer prayers, sacrifices, good examples, rosaries, attendance at Mass and sacramental and spiritual Communion, listing how many times they conscientiously practiced these devotions on their "treasure sheets", which are turned in to be tallied per parish chapters every month and subsequently published in the *Regina Coeli Report*.

In all 7 boys became engaged as Knights, 2 girls as Handmaids with 3 renewals in the same rank, also 19 boys and girls were newly engaged as Crusaders with 9 renewals in the same rank, and finally, 15 boys and girls were engaged at the first level of Page, making a total of 55 members of the Eucharistic Crusade at Our Lady Immaculate Chapter.

FR. VERLINDEN'S WHIRLWIND

From November 9th – 18th, Fr. Joseph Verlinden, prior of the SSPX's autonomous house in KAUNAS, LITHUANIA toured the USA DISTRICT to educate traditional Catholics in America about the Society's ongoing work in Lithuania, Estonia, and Russia, and to raise much-needed funds for the SSPX's work in this impoverished area of the world.

At each of the places that Fr. Verlinden visited, he gave a very interesting slide-show presentation, sometimes lasting up to 3 hours, but due to his lively humor, they were far from boring. Father's pictures also showed the level of poverty that generally exists in these countries and how the traditional Catholics of these regions do not have the financial means to support the SSPX's growing apostolate, hence, the need for some international fundraising.

As Fr. Verlinden is stationed in Lithuania, his talk centered around this country, which has been through many hardships, first under anti-Catholic Czarist Russia, which attempted to wipe out Catholicism in favor of Orthodoxy (thereby destroying much of Lithuanian culture, and replacing it with Russian)

then obtaining its independence as a nation after World War I only to lose it again under the Communist jackboot of the Soviets, who renewed the persecution against the Lithuanians and the Church. Finally in 1988, revolt against the illegitimate Soviet takeover was begun, which succeeded in making the country independent again in 1991.



Along with the SSPX's apostolates of Ignatian retreats, catechism classes and the Catholic press, the Third Order is being successfully established in Lithuania, and here we see the first Lithuanian (a converted university student) being received by Fr. Verlinden as a Tertiary.

ND TOUR IN USA DISTRICT

...this magnificent chapel dedicated to the image of Ausroš Vartai (seen above the altar), or *Mater Misericordæ*. This is one of the premiere shrines in Lithuania, as witnessed by the hundreds of *votos* that decorate the chapel's walls. Here travelers to and from Vilnius would traditionally seek Our Lady's blessing before making a trip, and give thanks upon a safe return.



In addition to regular catechism classes, the Lithuanian faithful are also instructed in the spiritual life, and here Fr. Naujokaitis gives an Ignatian Retreat to a small group.



Lithuanians have several interesting Catholic customs. Prescribed by the Lithuanian bishops, Benediction with the Blessed Sacrament is given after the Last Gospel at Mass, but in Eastern Rite fashion, keeping the ciborium covered with the humeral veil, during which a special Lithuanian hymn is sung, followed by public recitation of the Little Office and then catechism.



On Christmas Eve, a special dinner is prepared at home that consists of 12 meatless and dairy-free dishes (none of which can be omitted and are eaten only on the Eve), which must be blessed by a priest.



The Kaunas priory also has an active media apostolate. Books on Catholic Tradition were published in Lithuanian, as well as Gregorian chant recordings produced (to familiarize Lithuanians with singing Gregorian chant at Mass) and the printing of their own magazine, *Pulkim ant Reliu* (*Christians Drop to Your Knees*).

CANADA

On the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, December 8th, Frs. Carl Sulzen (originally of the United States) and Jean de l'Estourbeillon joyously made their perpetual engagements in the Society of St. Pius X.

For the clerical and religious members of the SSPX, the climax of their life as part of this canonically erected "pious

union" is their perpetual engagement, which can only be made with the permission of the Superior General (currently Bishop Fellay) and after having twice previously made a 3-year engagement. That the event was held on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception was no coincidence, as this is the date that Archbishop Lefebvre requested that the SSPX engagements take place.

On such a joyful occasion as this, let us remember to pray for the continual perseverance of the priests, deacons, subdeacons, brothers, seminarians and sisters of the SSPX.

After more than 20 years of waiting, the traditional Catholic faithful on the island of New Caledonia, grouped as the "St. Pius V Association of New Caledonia", were joyful to learn that the SSPX purchased a large piece of land (the sale of which transpired on the Nativity of Our Lady) in order to build a permanent mission. However, a loan had to be

obtained to facilitate the purchase, and in order to pay it back quickly, Fr. François Laisney, the Australian-New Zealand District Bursar, will be making a tour of the USA District in late April - May 2005, with a full-size photographic reproduction of the Holy Shroud of Turin for exposition, as well as a conference.
